CLOVELLY EAGLES 2016 - FAQs

Q: When do I find out which team I am in?

A: All players will be notified details of their team, their coach and manager once the registration process is completed.

Q: What are the age cut-off dates?

A: Players play in the age group corresponding to the age he/she turns in that calendar year. For example, a child born in 2007 will turn 9 in 2016 so will play in the U9s.

Q: Where and on what days do we play?

A: U6-U9 play on Saturday mornings at Nagle Park, Maroubra. The younger teams play earliest (beginning at 8am) and the older teams play up until midday. The draw is sent out once teams are finalized.

U10s and up play on Friday nights. These games are played at various times and locations. Your manager will advise you of the time and place once the draw is published.

Q: Where and when do we train?

A: Training for all teams takes place on either Monday or Wednesday afternoons at Burrows Park, Ocean Street, Clovelly. Your manager will let you know what day and time your team will be training once the coach is consulted and the training schedule is finalized.

Q: Where do we get our gear?

A The Club provides jerseys, shorts and socks and these will be distributed before Round 1. The cost of this is included in your registration fee. You will also need a mouthguard, football boots and headgear. Headgear is optional and as per player preference.

Q: Who do I contact if I have any queries/concerns?

A: Your first point of contact is your manager or coach. He or she should be able to assist or know how to find someone who can.

Q: Is there a Club website?

A: Yes, our website is clovellyeagles.com.au and it is constantly updated with the latest news and information. You will find a wealth of information on the website such as the minis draw, contact details for the committee, key dates, Club calendar, coaching resources and much more. Check it out! We also have a Facebook page.

Q: How do I receive information from my manager?

A: The Club uses TeamApp a quick and easy way to keep everyone informed of what is happening in the Club and within your team. You will be automatically registered with your team but to access it you will need to download the App. You will find instructions on how to do this on our website.

Q: When does the season start and end?

A: Round 1 is on Friday 1 April 2016 for Juniors and Saturday 2 April 2016 for Minis. Round 2 is on April 8 & 9 and then there is a break for the school holidays. We resume in Round 3 on Friday 29 and Saturday 30 April. There are no games in school holidays or the June long weekend. The final Round for Minis is Saturday 13 August. There is a Mini carnival at Nagle on 20 August.

For the Juniors, the final competition round is Friday 19 August and then there are finals rounds should teams make the finals.

Q: Does the Club hold any social events?

A: Yes the Club has a social night that is always a huge success. We will advise everyone of the date for this as soon as possible. We also have a ladies' night held at the Clovelly Hotel. Date tbc.

We have our Season Launch on 23rd March this year at Burrows from 4pm. We also have an end of season presentation afternoon at Burrows. A BBQ and drinks are provided at a nominal fee on these occasions.

Q: Are there canteen facilities at the grounds?

A: There is a canteen at Nagle which the village clubs take turns in organizing each Saturday. Our Club is rostered on twice throughout the season and requires volunteers from the Minis teams. It is not an onerous task – all the ordering of food is taken care of, it is just a matter of cooking the BBQ and serving. Given that our Club prides itself on being a Club of contributors, we encourage parents to put their hands up and help out on the BBQ or in the canteen on these two occasions.

As for the other grounds, it depends on the location. There is a canteen at Latham Oval.

Q: I would like to volunteer. How do I get involved?

A: Our Club is run by volunteers, which includes the committee, coaches, managers, canteen organisers and many other roles throughout the season. We are the biggest village club in the area so rely on all our members getting involved and helping our mighty club run smoothly.
