President's Report

The final whistle has blown on season 2011 and by any measure it was another successful year for the Eagles.

I am pleased to be able to report that our player numbers were up significantly in 2011, with around 250 boys proudly donning the Clovelly strip each week. We fielded 12 teams in the Easts / Randwick Minis competition (U6 – U9) and 7 teams in the SJRU Juniors competition (U10 – U13).

The Club enjoyed its fair share of on field success again this season and below is a summary -

In the Minis our U8 Reds were crowned Champions for their age group which is an outstanding effort. Both the U8's & U9's sent teams to the Harbord Harlequins Gala Day with the U8's going down in the Grand Final to the host Club. The U8's also sent a team to the Wahroonga Tigers Gala Day and came away with the silverware. Most importantly with the Minis was the huge development we saw in all the boys as the year progressed.

In the Juniors the U11 Blues and U13's made it through to the Grand Final with both unfortunately coming away runners up in tight matches. The good form of our Juniors teams didn't stop there with two of our U10 teams, our other U11 team and the U12's also playing in the semi-finals. I'm hopeful that next year we'll have some trophies to show for the hard work. The U12's followed on the great international form of last year tourists winning both games on their tour of New Zealand.

Clovelly again contributed a large number of players, along with a few coaches, to the Randwick Representative teams, with over 40 boys from across our teams competing in the State Championships. The U12's were again successful and have now won back to back Championships and the U11's were unlucky not to at least play in the final after going down in a tense semi-final.

The season was not without its challenges. The most notable continues to be the increasing issue of offering strong, viable competitions for our Juniors teams. This was particularly evident in the U12's and U13's who had only had four and five teams respectively in their competitions. The SJRU is well aware of the issue and is working with the Clubs to come up with options going forward. The use of Friday night, moving away from the traditional Saturday afternoon games, worked well in several age groups this year. For us as a Club it may also mean considering Sunday competitions especially once boys are in high school.

The ARU rolled out the new Pathways program for U6 – U12 players this season. This brought about a number of changes to

the various age groups aimed at increasing player participation and enjoyment. From what I witnessed and everyone I've spoken with the changes have been generally well accepted. There still needs to be some further work done in regards to some of the U6 initiatives but this seems to have more to do with the understanding and communication of the changes than the changes themselves.

As can be seen from the above the rugby that played throughout the age groups was a credit to the Club and District. This is in no small part due to the hard work of the Coaches and Managers who put in so much time and effort developing the skills of the boys and organising the teams. Anyone who has been at Burrows on a cold and windy afternoon / evening has evidenced the dedication shown by this group. We ask a lot of the Coaches and Managers to ensure that things run smoothly and on behalf of the Committee I would like to thank you all for your contribution.

There are also a number of supporters of our Club to acknowledge. Thank you to Randwick Seniors and Randwick Juniors for your support of rugby in the District. Also, thank you to our all our sponsors in 2011. In particular I would like to mention Macquarie Wealth, Bendigo Bank, Ravesis, the Clovelly Hotel and Grinners Catering who have all been so generous again this season. We value our relationship with all of these groups and look forward to continuing them in the years ahead.

Finally, I'd like to make a special mention of the Committee who take on the responsibility of running this mighty Club. We welcomed a number of new faces to the Committee this year (Deb Johnson, Stuart Dart, Rob Dick, Michael McSweeney, Andrew Black and Josh Smith) and they've brought with them a great deal of enthusiasm and passion. From Registration Day to arranging the Canteens and Social everyone has worked together to ensure that everything gets done. It is the strongest Committee I have been involved with during my time with the Club and ensures that the Eagles will continue to be the premier Club in the District.

To all the Clovelly players and parents I hope that you have enjoyed your season with the Eagles. We look forward to seeing you back at Burrows early in the new year.

Courtesy of our major sponsor, Macquarie Bank, we replaced all club jerseys this year. The financial report therefore reflects a significant increase in sponsorship revenue offset by an equivalent increase in clothing costs.

Elsewhere in the income categories, a disappointing deterioration in fundraising receipts from the various canteens and the annual social event was offset to some extent by a significant increase in revenue from registrations which continue to go from strength to strength. This season, we had close to 250 players registered with the club.

After some significant increases in previous years, the cost of participating in the various competitions we participate in appears to have stabilised to some extent, although we are in the usual situation of having to estimate how much we will be required to contribute for the season to our district club, Randwick.

This season, rather than continue to accumulate cash for

no specific purpose, the Committee took the decision to spend some of our previous years' surpluses on end of season gifts. The financial report therefore reflects a deficit for the year of a little over \$2,000.

Notwithstanding this extravagance, after allowing for nearly \$30,000 of outstanding payables relating to the end of season, we should finish the year with a little over \$15,000 in the bank. All in all therefore, the Club remains in a sound financial position at the completion of a very successful 2011 season.

For the Clovelly Reds Under 10 team the 2011 season was a most enjoyable one punctuated by a number of team and individual highlights. Each member of the team improved their skills and knowledge of the game and the Reds were capable of troubling any team on their day. The team's record finished at 3 wins from 14 matches and does not fairly illustrate the Reds' potential.

Thriving under coach Mark Johnson's enthusiasm and managers Virginia and Andrew Black's organisational efficiency the U10 Reds showed very pleasing improvement during the year gelling as a close knit unit both on and off the field.

Nick has developed a most effective scavenging technique successfully securing the ball time and time again and turning defence into attack with powerful runs through the opposition forwards. Nick scored nine tries and deservedly won the Best Forward award.
