
### **Jude McDermott**

### Greg Killeen Award for the Most Improved Minis Team

Greg played for the Eagles from 1975-77. He was seriously injured in a tragic accident whilst touring New Zealand in 1977 with the U15 team. This trophy was dedicated to Greg in 1978.





### Wally Meagher Award for the Most Improved Junior Team

Wally (1903-1966) played 100 first grade games for Randwick from 1923-1930. He represented NSW in 1929 and wallaby (8 tests). He was the Randwick coach from 1931-1953, president of NSWRU and Randwick club. He is widely acknowledged and the innovator behind the Galloping Greens running rugby. He also opened the first meeting to constitute the Clovelly Eagles club.





# Kelly Clifton Award for Exceptional Female Player Achievement

Kelly Clifton is the first female to play over 50 matches for the Clovelly Eagles. Playing with the eagles since 2015. She is a great example to all rugby players and hopefully we continue to see growth in participation.





# Jimmy Lane Award - President's Award for Excellence

A former vice president, Randwick Rugby Club, assistant president, ARU and co-founder of Randwick Junior Rugby. In the early 1960s Jimmy was nicknamed "Mr Randwick". Father in-law of past president Graham Geering and grandfather of Clovelly players Michael and Peter. When Jimmy died, his wife dedicated the trophy to the Club.



With 14 boys returning from last year, we were keen to get stuck into the 2021 season, the only problem was that the U12's comp was 15 a-side. This led us into our round 4 match up against the Clovelly Whites who we drew with in a trial match and we knew we'd have to play well to beat them. We worked on a game plan to disrupt their set piece and get off the line quickly in defence and the boys executed this perfectly, dominating all aspects of the game to record a resounding 40-7 win.

Our round 5 game was against Menai who were also undefeated. We started the game strongly going into the break 12-5 ahead, however, Menai turned to their big, physical forwards in the second and we struggled to contain them which ultimately gave then a 24-12 win. A good win against Burraneer the following week proved to be the last game of the year as the dreaded Covid

lockdowns hit us for the second year running to bring the season to a premature close.

The forwards were outstanding this year. The coaches asked to them to be aggressive and look to dominate their opponents at every contest; whether it be in the scrum, at the breakdown or in the tackle and they all stood up. Many cold beverages were sunk. Sausage sandwiches were devoured.


New friendships were formed. Old mates became better mates.




