# **LOOKING BACK**60 Year Anniversary

The history is palpable, the experiences character building and the friendships are to cherish. This is just a snapshot of the great times and history of the Clovelly Eagles Junior Rugby Football Club. We wish to recognise and thank the many who have volunteered, played, supported, and imparted their love of the game of rugby and have all contributed to the development and success of a great rugby community.

#### **Looking Back**

The Clovelly Club entered the first team under the auspices of the Coogee JRFC in 1961. The formal meeting to constitute The Clovelly Club was on October 17th of that year. This first team for the Clovelly Club was created by dividing the Coogee Under 10 side into two teams. It was decided that all players north of Dolphin or Bream Streets should play for Clovelly. Present at this first club meeting where F.W.Meagher, R.Sherwood, I.Turk, W.Thornton (Treasurer) and B.Gillie (Secretary) and W.Marchant (President). The Eastern Suburbs Randwick Junior Rugby Union competition started in 1959 with the president of the Coogee Club, Tony Blomberg, instrumental in helping to create the Clovelly JRFC.



#### 1961 - Clovelly Junior Rugby Football Club

In 1962, the committee approached Clovelly Public School, a rugby league stronghold, gaining the support of the principal and building a strong contingent of players. Ross Miles recalls the enthusiasm from he and a number of his mates. "In those days rugby league sides were selected on the basis of age and weight, ao all the heavier blokes like me jumped at the idea of getting a regular game of football."

Mr Bill Merchant was the president for 10 years becoming the first Life Member (page 10). He coached teams from U10 to U18.

The first team to play under the newly formed Clovelly Club in 1962. Players pictured include, John Stone, Ross Miles, Philip Lowe, Gary Hockey, Bill Merchant, Leigh Stone, Mark Cohen, Ross Wright, John Barnett, Paul Bolton and Danny Lavarch.

By 1963, the club had 5 teams. Two U10s, two U12s and one U14s. To begin training was at Coogee oval but soon switched to Burrows which became the home ground.

# **LOOKING BACK**Clovelly Eagles History



In the beginning all age groups played a 15 a side game on a full field. In 1974, Minis rugby for U7 and U8 was introduced. At various stages Clovelly fielded teams from U7 to U18. By 1984 Clovelly was the strongest club in the competition with 215 players.

A parallel committee was formed by parents to raise funds for the club. Claire Burke was the first committee president arranging gambling nights, raffles, and club nights. Trips away were arranged to Orange, Canberra, and New Zealand.

Clovelly competed against teams from all over the district including East/Randwick, Bays, Bellevue Hill, Bondi Boys, Bondi Sharks, Central Randwick, Coronation Park, De La Salle, Drummoyne Waratahs, Easts Colts, East Juniors, McAuley, Marcellen, Maroubra, Maroubra Bay, Marist Brothers Pagewood, Matraville, Randwick Colts, Randwick High, South Coogee, South Sydney, St.Brigids and Vaucluse.



# **LOOKING BACK**Clovelly Eagles History

#### **Eagles Community Tributes**

Looking back 50 years to our U8 1972 team. Two future Randwick First Graders in the middle back raw, Matthew Della Marta and Blake Veverka.



#### **Blake Veverka**

Blake Veverka played with the Eagles from 1971 to 1975, after attending Sydney Boys High, he joined the Randwick Colts. He played Winger for Randwick, playing 162 club games from 1985 to 1994, scoring 41 tries and 170 points. His 11 first grade games were spread across 1986 to 1991 producing 2 tries and 8 pts. He played in the 1986 First grade grand final and in five lower grade winning grand final sides.





#### **Matthew Della Marta**

Matthew was the youngest of 6 boys, and elder twin to the only girl Sara, of the Della Marta family who moved from Perth, WA to Randwick in early 1967. His father, Harley, was a VFL player in the early 50's and on moving to Randwick he took his young boys straight to Burrows Park to play this foreign game of Rugby.

Matthew began his rugby career at the age of 6 years with the 1970 Clovelly Under 7's. A furious tackler who initially struggled with the concept of team mates and opponents, merely tacked anyone who held the ball, no matter what team they were on. He went on to play with Clovelly Juniors for 6 years from 1970 to 1975 and represented East Randwick reps in U10's in 1974.

In 1978 and 1979 he played with South Coogee Juniors winning the district championship in both years. At this time Clovelly Eagles did not have U14 or U15 teams.





Matthew was reacquainted with Randwick Rugby when he joined Randwick Colts in 1982 to win a premiership in his first year. He went on to play 3 years of Colts, playing 50 first grade Colts games, captaining both Randwick and NSW Colts in 1984.

Matthew then joined the senior grades playing 253 club games from 1985 to 2002, scoring 30 tries and 1 goal with a total of 110 points. He played in 35 first grade games from 1985 to 1999. In 1985 where he was a member of the Premiership wining reserve grade team beating a highly fancied Manly team at the Sydney Sports ground. A decade later, in 1996 Matthew captained Randwick reserve grade to another challenging victory against a strong Eastwood team. Many past Clovelly junior players were part of this team including Lawson Donald, Jaysen Thompson, Chris Whitaker, coached by Ben Whitaker.

In his almost two decades at Randwick, Matthew went on to play and lead various grade teams. Added to his Reserve Grade Premierships, Matthew played in four 3rd grade grand finals, premiers in 1988, 1999 and 2000. He played in three 4th grade grand finals and premiered in 1990.

Shawn Mackay (1982-2009) was a Clovelly junior of immense potential playing 123 matches for the Eagles. A talented backrower who captained the Australian Rugby Sevens team (2005-2008) and represented the Brumbies. Tragically he lost his life in Durban whilst representing the Brumbies.

#### **Bill Singleton**

#### **Chris Whittaker Award**

The award goes to a player that shows the most potential in a minis team.

Chris is a local junior who played 106 matches for Clovelly, his family were massive supporters of the club who are both Life members. His illustrious rugby career included representing Randwick, the Waratahs (107 matches) and was Wallaby 747 (31 tests played, Captain 1 test). He is currently assistant coach to the Waratahs after overseas experiences in Europe.

#### **Ben Pearson**

#### Col Windon Award

The award goes to a player that shows the most potential in a junior team.

Col Windon (1921-2003) was a former patron of our club, a WWII veteran and rugby legend. Arguably Australian rugby's greatest ever flanker and undoubtedly the Wallabies premier attacking flanker of all time. He played and coached Randwick. Represented New south Wales, and become Wallaby 337 (20 tests played, Captain for 2 tests). He was as inaugural inductee to the ARU Hall of Fame.

#### Greg Killeen Award for the Most Improved Minis Team

Greg played for the Eagles from 1975-77. He was seriously injured in a tragic accident whilst touring New Zealand in 1977 with the U15 team. This trophy was dedicated to Greg in 1978.

#### **U8** Black



#### Wally Meagher Award for the Most Improved Junior Team

Wally (1903-1966) played 100 first grade games for Randwick from 1923-1930. He represented NSW in 1929 and wallaby (8 tests). He was the Randwick coach from 1931-1953, president of NSWRU and Randwick club. He is widely acknowledged and the innovator behind the Galloping Greens running rugby. He also opened the first meeting to constitute the Clovelly Eagles club.

#### U12 Red



#### Kelly Clifton Award for Exceptional Female Player Achievement

Kelly Clifton is the first female to play over 50 matches for the Clovelly Eagles. Playing with the eagles since 2015. She is a great example to all rugby players and hopefully we continue to see growth in participation.

#### **Harlow Taylor**



#### Jimmy Lane Award - President's Award for Excellence

A former vice president, Randwick Rugby Club, assistant president, ARU and co-founder of Randwick Junior Rugby. In the early 1960s Jimmy was nicknamed "Mr Randwick". Father in-law of past president Graham Geering and grandfather of Clovelly players Michael and Peter. When Jimmy died, his wife dedicated the trophy to the Club.



# **TRAINING WITH THE WARATAHS**Mid-season Training



At Clovelly Eagles we take our training and skills development seriously.
